Dear Board of Parole Hearings,

Thank you for the opportunity to address the Board regarding the administrative review of inmate Wesley Gabourie, and his suitability for early release.

Based on my knowledge of the case against Mr. Gabourie and his prior criminal history, he should not be released prior to serving out his sentence. This is based, not only on the facts of the case in his current commitment to CDCR, but also based on his prior convictions, which show a history of serious criminal conduct.

The overarching theme of our deal with Mr. Gabourie was for him to spend 7 years of actual confinement at CDCR. The People analyzed his lengthy criminal resume and decided it was appropriate to utilize his prior 459 1<sup>st</sup> strike conviction, (even though it was from 1992), to double his drug and theft cases. Mr. Gabourie agreed and the plea negotiations included not charging a pending case involving a commercial burglary and not pursuing a new strike offense which involved violence against his own mother.

Mr. Gabourie has, for the past few decades shown a callous disregard for the law and society. Given the seriousness of this offense, (including crimes dismissed as part of the plea), his past convictions, and his lengthy criminal history, he should not be considered for early release as a "non-violent second striker".
