Dear Board of Parole Hearings,

Thank you for the opportunity to address the Board regarding the administrative review of inmate Uhila Amone, BC2660, and his suitability for early release. Based upon his criminal history and the facts of his recent case, Inmate Amone poses an unreasonable risk to public safety and should be not considered for early release.

In the instant offense, Inmate Amone used a credit card of the victim and took money out of the victim's account. Inmate Amone tried a second time to remove money from the victim's account by was unable to do so when the cashier noticed that the identification of the card did not match Inmate Amone. The credit card had been stolen in a robbery and burglary in San Francisco. While this crime does not involve violence, it is another theft crime committed by Inmate Amone. Additionally, identify theft is the type of crime that involves repeat victimization and may take years to recover from.

Inmate Amone has a history of theft offenses. His prior strike offense is for robbery which he was convicted of in 2009 and he suffered a violation of probation in 2011. In 2015, Inmate Amone was convicted of two more theft offenses in Utah. A little more than one year later, Inmate Amone committed the offense for which he is in prison.

Inmate Amone has demonstrated no regard for the property of others and should not be given an early release.
